On Tuesday 20 October Channel 5 aired The Yorkshire Vet programme which featured a falconer, Mr Potter, wearing a bracelet made from pigeon racing rings. Understandably, this angered a number of pigeon fanciers. On behalf of the Confederation Voice were asked to liaise with Mr Potter regarding the programmes content, specifically the bracelet and the origin of the rings.

The rings originated from members of a local pigeon club. Mr Potter immediately issued a written apology which has been printed in the fancy press previously and has assured us that he is deeply sorry for any upset or stress which he has caused to pigeon fanciers.

Mr Potter returned the bracelet to the pigeon club that had originally provided him with the deceased pigeons. We have confirmed this has taken place and that the bracelet has indeed been returned to the club therefore the matter is now closed.

Congratulations to the National Gamekeepers Organisation, who has won a landmark legal battle on behalf of one of it's members, after a Judicial Review at the High Court in London quashed the decision of Natural England.

Natural England refused to issue a National Gamekeepers Organisation member with a licence to control a small number of buzzards that were causing serious damage to young pheasants in his care.

This is of course great news for pigeon fanciers as the court's judgment has established that in order to be lawful, wildlife decisions must in future be made fairly and based on the facts.
